



## SPIKE LEE IN CONVERSATION


Saturday, January 18, 7:30 p.m.



#### BIOGRAPHY

#### South Saskatchewan Youth Orchestra

The South Saskatchewan Youth Orchestra began in the fall of 1977 as a result of the leadership of Ernest Kassian. As a professor of music at the University of Regina, Kassian received a grant from the Saskatchewan Arts Board in 1976 to travel to Russia and the Ukraine, researching Youth Orchestra activity and gaining valuable experience conducting. Upon his return, Kassian began the SSYO. The Orchestra expanded to 55 members by 1981 when it made its first major trip. travelling to Banff for the Canadian Festival of Youth Orchestras

The SSYO entered a new era in 1989 when Alan Denike became Conductor and Music Director. Under his direction, the Orchestra has grown from 45 to as many as 80 musicians. He has led the Orchestra to Gold Medal performances in Festivals at Orlando (1991), Montreal (1995), and Chicago (2002). In 2000, the SSYO was selected as the host orchestra for the Aberdeen International Youth Festival in Scotland; in 2004, the SSYO participated in the Canadian Youth Orchestra Festival in Ottawa, and in 2006, the Orchestra iourneyed to Vienna, Austria, for the International Youth Music Festival where they earned third place. In 2008, the SSYO was invited to be the host orchestra for the Niagara International Music Festival.

In 2001, the SSYO added the expertise of Rudolf Sternadel as Director's Assistant and Librarian. Currently the Head of the Child/Parent String Program at the Regina Conservatory of Performing Arts, Rudolf is also a member of the Regina Symphony Orchestra.

Membership in the SSYO is by audition. with the present roster including members from Moose Jaw, Earl Grey, Lumsden, Weyburn, Emerald Park, Buena Vista, and Regina. Many SSYO members have gone on to join the Regina Symphony Orchestra, the National Youth Orchestra of Canada, and other professional orchestras across Canada

#### Alan Denike. Music Director/Conductor

Alan Denike has been Principal Bassoon in the Regina Symphony Orchestra and the Regina Symphony Chamber Players since 1974. He holds a Bachelor of Music Degree and a Performer's Certificate in Bassoon Performance from the Eastman School of Music, University of Rochester, New York. He has also earned a Master's Degree in Conducting from the University of Regina in 1989. Mr. Denike has conducted the Regina Symphony Orchestra, Regina Community Orchestra, Regina Summer Stage, the Prairie Pops Orchestra and the University of Regina Concert Band. He has taught at the Saskatchewan Summer School of the Arts, the Courtenay, B.C. Music Camp and at the International Peace Gardens. Mr. Denike is in demand as a clinician/ adjudicator throughout the province and Western Canada and was the Senior Woodwind Adjudicator for the British Columbia Provincial Music Festival in Victoria in 2004. In 2007, Mr. Denike was awarded the Arts Management Award by the City of Regina's Mayor's Arts and Business Awards

#### **Calgary Youth Orchestra**

Mount Royal Conservatory's Calgary Youth Orchestra (CYO) conducted a successful tour of France in August, 2012, to celebrate the 150th anniversary of Claude Debussy's birth. "The Calgary Youth Orchestra of Canada created magical moments for music lovers... Under the direction of Edmond Agopian the young musicians transcended the music..." Ouest France, Caen, France

The CYO, considered the Conservatory's flagship instrumental ensemble, is recog-nized as one of the finest youth orchestras in the country. The ensemble has worked with such illustrious conductors as Mario Bernardi, Bramwell Tovey, Kasuyoshi Akiyama, Simon Streatfeild, Ivars Taurins, Jeanne Lamon, and Hans Graf, among others. The CYO has performed in collaboration with the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra and with Jeunesse Classique Ballet, at festivals throughout Europe, Australia, New Zealand, and Japan, and on-stage at the 2008 Juno Awards. The CYO was honoured to perform for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II during her visit to Calgary in May, 2005 as well as for the Council of the Federation in Banff in August, 2005. In September 2009. in recognition of His Holiness, the Dalai Lama's visit to Calgary, the CYO performed at the Pengrowth Saddledome alongside members of the University of Calgary Orchestra.

The orchestra has commissioned works from a number of composers, most recently Canadian composers Michael van der Sloot, George Fenwick and Laurie Radford.

The CYO has also presented the world premieres of works by Claude Debussy, completed and orchestrated by the renowned English musicologist Robert Orledge. CYO's high artistic achievements have generated national and international reviews for its performances and for its recording titled The Thrill of the Western. The CYO will tour Germany in August, 2014.

#### Edmond Agopian, Conductor

Edmond Agopian began his violin training in Constantza, Romania, which culminated in a Master's degree from The Julliard School. As a violinist, he has been a member of many chamber music ensembles, and has commissioned and premiered numerous Canadian compositions, both as conductor and violinist. He has been featured on CBC Radio regional and national programs as well as on radio and TV networks in Europe, China, and Taiwan. He is the first violinist of the UCalgary String Quartet, U of C's string quartet in residence. Conducting work has included performances with the Shanghai Opera Orchestra, the National Arts Centre Orchestra, the Canadian Chamber Orchestra (conductor and concertmaster), and yearly engagements with the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra. He has a joint appointment as a Professor at the University of Calgary and Artistin-Residence at Mount Royal University Conservatory, where in 2002 he was appointed Music Director of the Calgary Youth Orchestra.

#### **Edmonton Youth Orchestra**

The Edmonton Youth Orchestra Association, formed in 1952, supports two nationally renowned symphony orchestras: The Intermediate Youth Orchestra, and The Senior Youth Orchestra. Through these two orchestras, the EYO's music program, one of the finest in Canada, provides the highest possible standard of orchestral training and experience to over 150 music students from age 11 to 24. The EYO experience has a profound and lasting impact on the lives of EYO "graduates". Some become music teachers, members of professional orchestras, or soloists. All are motivated students sharing a love of music. Our program includes regular weekly rehearsals from September through May, concert performances for each orchestra. weekend workshops, scholarships, and a concerto competition jointly sponsored by the EYO and the Alberta Registered Music Teachers' Association. Players for both orchestras are selected by competitive auditions held each May.

#### Michael Massey, Conductor

Michael Massey has been conductor of the Edmonton Youth Orchestra (FYO) since 1977. He is a pianist with the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra, and widely respected as a soloist, teacher, and accompanist. He appears as a freelance quest conductor, locally and abroad. and has conducted the Philharmonia Orchestra, London, England, the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra, and the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra. Michael was inducted to the Edmonton Cultural Hall of Fame at the Salute to Excellence Honour Awards ceremony at the Winspear Centre June 11, 2002. and also received a "Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal" on October 16, 2002, in recognition of his work.
